Global Politics of Knowledge Lessons from the Global South

May 19th 2017

The term 'decolonization' has become a buzzword across academic disciplines. The persistence of colonial power relations in education and beyond has led to the general tendency that knowledge applied in the Global South is produced in the Global North. This conference aims to provoke a dialogue between various academic disciplines in order to discuss ways to challenge this knowledge hegemony. After a historical introduction to the issue, participants will discuss chances, risks and costs of different approaches to counter these colonial power relations. The final panel discusses interdisciplinary research in different contexts as a possible challenge to colonial powers relations. The conference is kindly sponsored by the German Academic Scholarship Foundation (Studienstiftung des deutschen Volkes) and supported by the Centre of Latin American Studies, University of Cambridge.
