ABSTRACT

Documentary following the story of the Chilean refugees who arrived in South Yorkshire, UK in the 1970s.

In this film screening, director Chris Paul will be *in conversation with* Carole Concha Bell (King's College PhD Researcher and Journalist) and Dr Grace Livingstone (journalist and academic, specialising in Latin American affairs).



Chris Paul has a MA Latin American Studies from the Institute for the Study of the Americas, University of London, where he focussed on politics, media and migration. He specialises in film and audio pieces on oral history and migration. He's written articles and produced multimedia work for the Migration Museum, Latin America Bureau, and Sounds & Colours.



Carole Concha Bell is a PhD candidate at King's College London and a former child refugee. She is researching Chilean second-generation diaspora literature and regime discourse at the Spanish, Portuguese and Latin American Department (SPLAS) located in the faculty of Languages, Literature & Culture (DLLC). She is also a regular contributor to national and international media on the subject of Chilean politics and Indigenous rights.



Dr Grace Livingstone is a journalist and academic, specializing in Latin American affairs. She has reported for the BBC World Service, *The Guardian*, *The Observer*, *The Independent on Sunday* and the *New Statesman*. She is an affiliated lecturer at the Centre of Latin American Studies, University of Cambridge.
