THE POLICRISIS IN LATIN AMERICA

Fernando Calderon (Director of Research at the National University of San Martin in Buenos Aires, Simón Bolívar Professor 2017-18)

Abstract: The idea behind this seminar is that the transformations currently taking place in LATAM (Latin America) and, more broadly, in the Third World are interconnected on a global scale. Specifically, they are linked to a polycrisis or global multidimensional crisis that asynchronously affects all societies and modes of development.

To comprehend this from a holistic perspective, and based on a framework of empirical and historical research throughout 12 years, three interconnected presentations have been proposed:

* First session in Spanish, next two in English.

- 1. The first** one will aim at analyzing a kind of sociological assessment of the continuity of long-term historical time in LATAM (Latin America), with the thesis that the past, present, and future are recurring and inseparable phenomena.
- 2. The second** discussion will examine the main features of the polycrisis and societal transformations going on in the region.
- 3. Finally, the third** one will propose the need for a new political framework and a techno-cultural innovation to rethink an informational, inclusive, and ecological development centered on human dignity.

Fernando Calderon. Director of Research at the National University of San Martin in Buenos Aires, Professor in the PhD in Social Sciences Program and in the Master Program in Human Development Public Policies at Latin American Faculty of Social Sciences (FLACSO) Argentina.

He taught at several universities in the United States of America (Austin, Chicago, Berkeley, and Cornell); at the Open University of Catalonia (UOC) in Barcelona (Spain); Le centre de études Global at the La Maison des Sciences de le Homme, in Paris, France; the Mayor University of San Andrés (UMSA) in La Paz (Bolivia), and in various universities in Mexico, Puerto Rico, Venezuela, and Chile.

He was Executive Secretary of Latin American Social Science Council (CLACSO), Social Policy Advisor at Economic Commission for Latin America and the Caribbean (ECLAC) and Special Advisor on Human Development and Governance in United Nations Development Program (UNDP).

Coordinator and Senior Advisor in over 15 *Human Development Reports* in several countries of Latin America, Europe and Africa, and at sub-regional and global levels. In 2000 and 2002, the *Human Development Report* in Bolivia, which coordinated, was awarded worldwide.

ERUDITE Scholar in Residence from the Kerala State in Education Council. India 2019. Simon Bolivar Chair, University of Cambridge, 2017-2018. Doctorado Honoris Causa UNSAM, Argentina, 2018. Profesor Honorario Universidad Mayor de San Simón, Cochabamba, Bolivia, 1992.

Associated with several activities with UNESCO since 1972, with UNICEF, UNRISD, UNU, ONU and several international organisations.

Author of 24 books on democracy, culture and development, and 35 Readings in these topics. His book, with Manuel Castells, [The New Latin America](#), has three editions in different languages: FCE, Mexico, 2019 (Spanish), ZAHAR, Brazil, 2020 (Portuguese), and Polity Press, Cambridge UK/Polity Press, Medford, 2020 (English).
